Students will continue to learn with the vocabulary they have previously learned from ASL Level One and will be covering the next two vocabulary units available to build onto their current knowledge base. New knowledge includes, but will not be limited to, discussing living situations, giving basic directions and commands involving a location, expressing needs, asking what a sign is, expressing travel times, contrastive structure, forming negative responses, talking about family and age ranking as well as comments on members, telling age, and additional number vocabulary.

Homework is assigned every week. They will also have quizzes, midterms and final exams. Students will receive a grade at the end of the year for the course, as well as a Certificate of Completion. All materials are included for the class in the form of YouTube links sent out weekly through email.

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Terry Moore - is a certified Early Education Educator and past Homeschool Mom. She studied at SPCC in Monroe, NC, as well as ASL with Michigan State University. While homeschooling her own daughter Terry learned how important it is to teach children that learning can be fun. Terry has been teaching ASL for the past 17 years and with The Homeschool Room for the past 14 years. She has also taught Deaf children and Senior Citizens that were losing their hearing to use Sign Language. Terry has taught classes in Matthews, Huntersville, Concord, Gastonia, and Mooresville in addition to teaching children and adults in her church.

Terry herself is Hard-of-Hearing and unable to use verbal speech as a form of communication due to having cancer 19 years ago. This resulted in a surgery to remove her larynx, “voice box”. For this reason she is very passionate about teaching

an accurate & correct form of American Sign Language to all her students so they can feel confident when communicating through signing.

Terry's daughter Tasha has grown up signing and is now a graduate of Central Piedmont Community College (CPCC) and Appalachian State University with an Associate Degree in Interpreter Education and a Bachelors of Sciences in Communication. Tasha works at CPCC full-time, is a freelance religious interpreter, and is also Terry's assistant in all of her classes.
